Robert M. Mink is the Deputy Director of the Geological Survey of Alabama. He received his Bachelor of Science degree in Geology and Master of Science degree from the University of Alabama.

Mink was employed as an exploration geologist by Tenneco Oil Company from 1979 to 1982 in Lafayette, Louisiana. His principal area of investigation while at Tenneco was the Mississippi, Alabama, and Florida offshore region. In 1982, he joined the State Oil and Gas Board of Alabama as Assistant Oil and Gas Supervisor for the Geophysics and Offshore Division. His duties included supervision and coordination of geological and geophysical research on the petroleum geology of southwestern and offshore Alabama. Mink joined the Geological Survey of Alabama in 1989, when he became Assistant State Geologist for Energy Resources. In 1990, he became Deputy Director of the Geological Survey of Alabama and his duties include supervision and coordination of research related to economic and environmental geology and hydrogeology.

His research and publications include geologic characterization and hydrocarbon resource assessment for the southwestern and offshore areas of Alabama and sand resource assessment for the coastal Alabama area.
